DECISION CHECKLIST: CONSIDERING MASTECTOMY WITH OR WITHOUT RECONSTRUCTION

Questions to help you choose between mastectomy or lumpectomy with radiation

If I choose lumpectomy and radiation over mastectomy, what is involved? What short-term and long-term side effects should I know about?
If I have a mastectomy, what are the short-term and long-term risks? Do you suggest a preventive mastectomy for my opposite breast?
Given my genetic status, what is my risk for a new breast cancer diagnosis if I choose mastectomy? What is my risk if I choose lumpectomy and radiation?
Will I be more symmetrical if I choose double mastectomy vs. lumpectomy and radiation?
If I choose lumpectomy, will it be necessary to rearrange the remaining breast tissue for symmetry? If so, would that procedure be done by a breast surgeon or a plastic surgeon?
If I choose mastectomy, will you be able to preserve the nerves that provide sensation? How much sensation am I likely to have and where? How will it differ from the sensation I have in my breasts now? How frequently do you perform this procedure? If I have a lumpectomy and radiation, will I lose any sensation?
Am I a candidate for nipple-sparing mastectomy? How many times have you performed this procedure? Will my nipples lose sensation or flatten if I keep them? Is there a higher risk for breast cancer in the remaining nipple tissue?
What is my risk for lymphedema after mastectomy or lumpectomy and radiation? Is one procedure more likely than the other to cause lymphedema?
What type of short-term and long-term follow-up care or imaging would I need after lumpectomy and radiation? What would I need after double mastectomy with or without reconstruction?
If I choose lumpectomy and radiation now, can I have a preventive double mastectomy later? Will my insurance cover it? Will the radiation change my future reconstruction options or outcomes?
If I choose mastectomy, will I have my choice of plastic surgeons and reconstruction options?
If I choose lumpectomy, how big would my incision be and what would it look like? What would my incision look like if I choose mastectomy?

	Will you perform an aesthetic flat closure so that my mastectomy scars are flat against my chest? How many times have you performed this procedure?
	Am I a candidate for a Goldilocks or SWIM mastectomy? How many of these procedures have you done? How would my chest look after?
	Am I a candidate for nipple-sparing mastectomy? How many times have you performed this procedure? Will my nipples lose sensation if I keep them? Is there a higher risk for breast cancer in the remaining tissue?
	Will I need a plastic surgeon if I do not have reconstruction? If so, how will the plastic surgeon complete the surgery?
	Can my nipples be recreated? If so, when, how and by whom?
	Can I have 2D or 3D nipple tattooing with or without nipple reconstruction? If so, when, howand by whom?
	What is my risk for breast cancer after surgery? What should I look for? How will you monitor me?
	If I don?t have immediate reconstruction, can I have reconstruction in the future?
	May I see patient before and after photos?

	What future MRI or ultrasound screenings are recommended if I have implants?	
	Will I need tissue expanders or am I a candidate for direct-to-implant? How many of these procedures have you performed?	
	Will I have round or teardrop implants? Why? What profile (projection) is best for me? Why?	
	What type of implants do you use?	
	What is the difference in recovery time, discomfort level, outcomes and risks for complications between implants placed above or below the muscle(s)? Do I have a choice in which method is used? Which method do you prefer?	
	How many surgeries will be required?	
	How long can I expect the implants to last? When will they need to be replaced? How will aging and future weight fluctuations affect my reconstructed breast(s)?	
	What problems, including rupture or leaks, might occur? What signs should I look for? How often and how should my implants be screened for rupture?	
	Are short-term and long-term infections after surgery a concern?	
	Who will provide the warranty information for my implants?	
	When will we discuss and sign the FDA required ?Patient Decision Checklist?? Please provide a copy of the signed checklist for my records.	
	What are the signs of and risk for breast implant-related long-term complications, such as breast implant-associated anaplastic large cell lymphoma (BIA-ALCL)?	
	Will I have any long-term restrictions on the types of activities I can do?	
	Do you use an acellular dermal matrix with your reconstruction?	
	May I see before-and-after photos of your patients who have had this procedure?

How will my donor site look afterward? Will I have visible scarring there? Will I lose sensation there?			
☐ Will I need postoperative physical or occupational therapy to regain strength, flexibility and range of motion at the donor site?			
☐ How many surgeries will be required?			
☐ How will aging and future weight fluctuations affect my reconstructed breast(s)?			
☐ Do I need to make any lifestyle changes to prepare for flap reconstruction?			
☐ How do risks and long-term quality differ between implants and flap reconstruction?			
☐ Will I have any long-term restrictions on the types of activities I can do?			
☐ May I see before-and-after photos of your patients who have had this procedure?			
Questions to help you choose between reconstruction or going flat

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Questions for your breast surgeon before mastectomy
☐ How can I get a copy of my pathology report?
What is my risk for breast cancer after surgery? What should I look for? How will you monitor me?
☐ Will I be at risk for lymphedema (arm swelling) after surgery? Will I be educated on symptoms, treatment and long-term precautions?
☐ Do you recommend physical therapy before surgery (pre-hab) and/or after surgery (re-hab)? Will you write a prescription for it? Will insurance cover it?
☐ Will you be able to preserve the nerves that provide sensation? How much sensation am I likely to have and where? How will it differ from the sensation I have in my breasts now?
☐ Will I need a special mastectomy bra after surgery? If so, will you provide it? Does my health insurance cover the cost?
☐ Am I a candidate for sentinel lymph node biopsy?
Am I a candidate for nipple-sparing mastectomy? How many times have you performed this procedure? Will my nipples lose sensation or flatten if I keep them? Is there a higher risk for breast cancer in the remaining tissue?
☐ If my nipples are removed, can they be recreated? If so, when, how and by whom?
Can I have 2D or 3D nipple tattooing with or without nipple reconstruction? If so, when, how and by whom?
☐ How long after surgery can I drive? How long until I can reach above my head? How long before I can lift items over five pounds? How long before I can lift heavier items?
☐ Which of my medications should I take or avoid before the surgery? Are there any supplements I should take or avoid?
☐ What are the surgical risks? What are the anesthetic risks?
Questions about insurance coverage
☐ Will my insurance cover the cost for mastectomy? Will my insurance cover the cost for reconstruction? What are my estimated out-of-pocket costs?
